Children's Home of Cincinnati

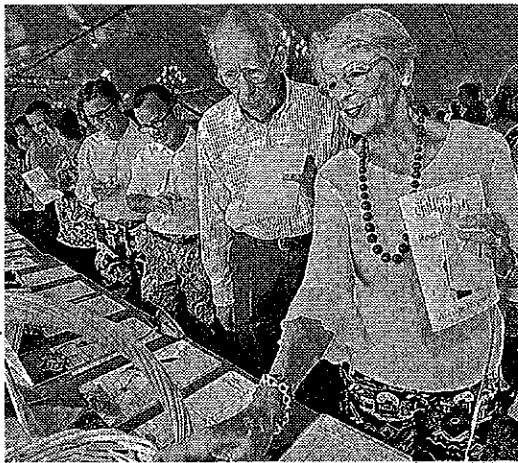
