Founded in 1864, The Children's Home of Cincinnati is a private, nonprofit organization that provides education and mental health treatment to vulnerable children with social, behavioral, and learning challenges.

What We Do

The Children's Home provides education and mental health treatment for children of all ages – and their families – through a wide array of intensive day programs and community-based services.

Who We Serve

The children we serve may have experienced trauma, abuse, neglect, poverty, or other factors that inhibit their healthy growth and development. Often, their families have little or no access to the resources they need, and these children need support to manage their emotions and behaviors, experience healthy development, and overcome learning challenges that would otherwise prevent them from succeeding.

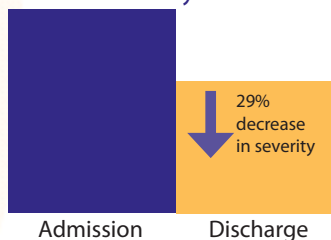

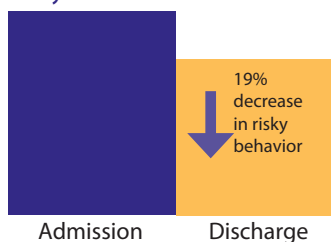
Admission to Discharge

Children showed a statistically significant reduction in problems and increase in functioning from admission in our programs to discharge.

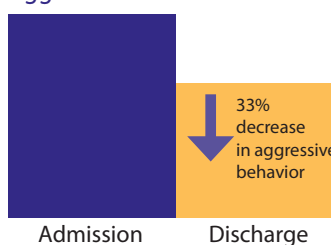
Problem Severity



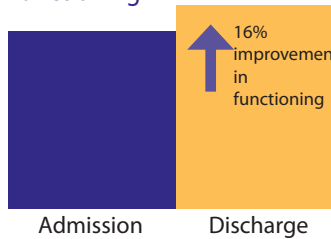
Risky Behavior

93% of students in The Children's Home school graduated, went back to their community school, or required less intensive services.

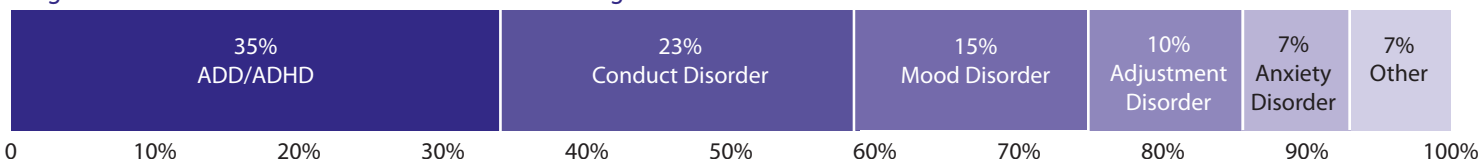
85% of children with mental health diagnoses are better able to manage their problems and emotions.

Diagnoses of Children in Mental Health and School Programs



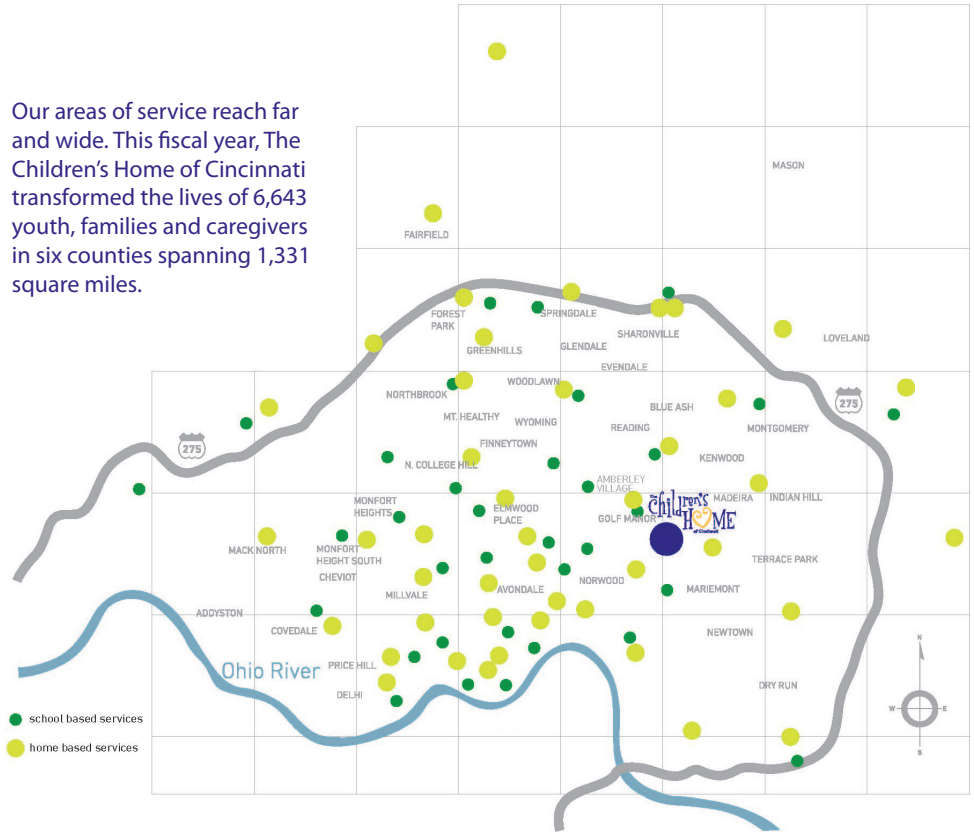
What distinguishes The Children's Home from the crowd?

Our array of innovative services and expertise, which reach deeply into the lives of vulnerable children to make long-lasting transformations.

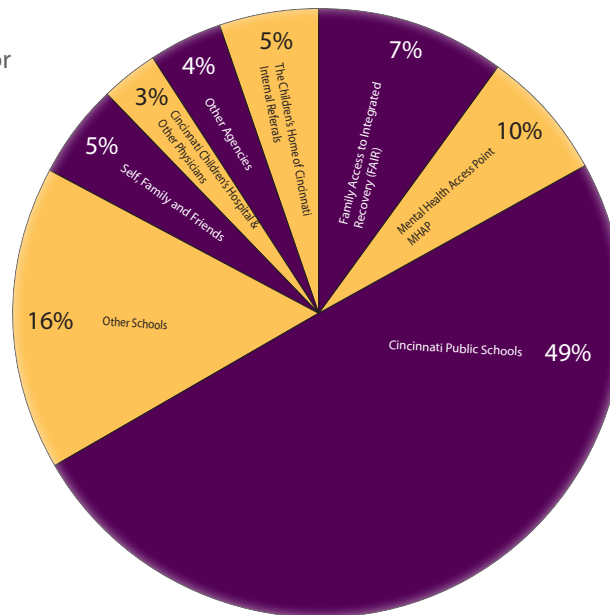
Among many unique characteristics, The Children's Home:

- Is a certified sponsor site for the Teaching Family Model, making us one of only 16 others in North America to be certified in this evidence-based treatment model for children.
- Provides the only Early Childhood Day Treatment program in the region.
- Has the only therapeutic high school with job readiness programming.
- Is the only nonprofit organization in Hamilton County with day treatment services for high school students.
- Is the only local nonprofit organization to have all Mental Health staff trained in the CARE (Child and Adult Relationship Enhancement) or TF-CBT (Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy) models.
- Has the greatest number of mental health professionals in educational settings, with a presence in 80+ public schools.
